Phil's Prez report – 2023 AGM

Hi everyone,

Thank you all for attending. As always, I'd like to start off by thanking my amazing Executive for all their hard work and time. I appreciate you all!

I would like to take this opportunity to apologize to the CTS as a whole.

Since I was elected to the position of president, I have not fully committed to the job as much as I would have liked. Life kind of got in the way – my Mum passing and struggling with that personally, and constantly going to the island helping my Dad. Then I thought it would be good to go back to school and add more work for myself.

I'm never one to make excuses, but I do again apologize that I have not accomplished nearly half of what I had hoped, and would like to thank my team for their patience with me through all the changes over the last few years.

OK - on to tennis stuff!

Membership

Our membership stayed very consistent in 2022-2023 with the previous year. 76 total members (2021 - 73) 22 new members (2021 - 17)

I've had the opportunity to meet and/or provide lessons to some of the new members. They're a super group of people.

Tennis Lessons:

I have provided a consistent time for a new beginner adult group. That is something we've always wanted to have. It has been a lot of fun coaching this group. Their dedication and desire to get better is awesome!

My kiddos continue to be the lights in my days. Numbers continue to increase and we have many up and comers as registration has taken off in the 5 - 8-year-old age bracket.

I have a very good core of 6 or so kids (around 12 years old) who have stuck with me over the years and have become a very strong group. A couple of them continue to go into sanctioned tournaments and do very well.

Unfortunately, due to schedules – mine, Tennis Canada's, and the kid's – there was never a time to run a Youth event this summer. There are never enough weekends! We'll try again for next Spring!

The good news is we're on Tennis Canada and Tennis BC's radar. I was rubbing shoulders with some of the brass during the Billie Jean King Cup in Vancouver, and they all mentioned Chilliwack and the exciting stuff coming out of here, so that was encouraging to hear!

Indoor Tennis

Indoor Facility

OK, this is my last order of business and then I'll stop yacking!!

Here's a quick rundown for the minutes, so we'll all have a pretty good idea where we are at.

This March we were called to have a meeting with the City. New funding had been granted from the Provincial Government to cities and municipalities for capital projects and infrastructure improvements. The Indoor Racquet facility was back on the table. As before, this is planned to be a shared facility including Tennis and Squash.

Several meetings took place to try and understand everyone's positions – ours, the Squash Club's, and the City's. We had many concerns as to what kind of structure the tennis court section of the building would actually going to be. We questioned the cost and functionality of a non-rigid structure which is what the City was proposing. We provided lots of feedback on that!

A HUGE thanks to Stephanie who worked with me crunching numbers through several meetings so we could provide the best possible picture to the City regarding potential operating costs and revenues. We also had great help and feedback from Tennis Canada and other tennis clubs and facilities.

At the end we basically presented City staff with several options, and included pros/cons for each of them.

The last I heard from the city is the design teams are still working on it, and there is no distinct timeline at this point.

So, all we can do is wait and hope they have taken all our info into account.
